

Traditional (Print) Resources

Books: Cite books beginning with the name of the author or editor. Follow this with the publication year in parenthesis. After the year, place the book name in italics. Last, include the place of publication.

Meachem, J. (2008). *American Lion: Andrew Jackson in the White House*. New York: Random House.

Purkey, W. W., & Siegel, B. L. (2003). *Becoming an inspirational leader: A new approach to professional and personal success*. Atlanta: Humanics Trade Group.

An Excerpt from a Book Within Another Book:

Karlsen, C. F. (1987). The Girls' response was a response to stifling social conditions. *The Salem Witch Trials*. In Laura Marvel(Ed.). (2003). *The Salem Witch Trials* (pp. 87-94). Farmington Hills: Greenhaven Press.

Articles: Start with the author's name, followed by the publication year in parenthesis. Then list the title of the article, followed by, in italics, the title of the book or periodical that the article was published in. Also include the volume number, issue number (for journals), and page numbers.

Article from a Reference Book:

McLean, I., & McMillan, A. (2003). Gaullism. In *The Concise Oxford Dictionary of Politics* (pp. 219). New York: Oxford University Press.

Article from a Scholarly Journal:

Phalen, T. (2009). More than a trend: Maximizing the potential of the Prehospital 12-lead ECG. *Journal of Emergency Medical Services*, 34(3), 18-22.

Weekly or Bi-Weekly Magazine Article:

Darmen, J. (2009, April 27). Spitzer in exile: When your resume says 'Disgraced Ex-Governor,' what do you do next? *Newsweek*, 53(17), 20-27.

Monthly Magazine Article:

Thomas, L. (2009, April). Kentucky's wild wonder. *Southern Living*, 44(5), 98-101.

Article from a Newspaper:

Hungerford, A. (2009, April 22). Olens running, but not for Governor. *Marietta Daily Journal*, p. 1A.

Live Speech:

Obama, M. (2008, August). One nation. Speech presented at the 2008 Democratic National Convention, Denver, CO.



Electronic Resources

How you access a resource online will affect how it is cited. Include the same information that you would with a print resource. Also include the date you accessed the material. Include the DOI/Document ID of an article, if available, and if the DOI is not available, give the url of library databases, and give the url for specific documents or articles from an internet website.

Electronic Book from NetLibrary:

Note: Use the phrase 'available from' when citing an electronic book that comes from a purchased subscription service, such as NetLibrary.

Newspaper Article:

Article from an Online Magazine: An article retrieved directly from an online source and not from a Galileo or Library database. Include the volume/issue number and page numbers if available. Also include the url of the article if available.

Document from a Professional Website:

An Entire Website:

When you are referring to an entire website, and not to a document on the website, you do not need to include the entire website in your reference list. Rather, insert the url of the website in the text of your paper as shown. (<http://www.acsi.org/>)
