SAP—SATISFACTORY ACADEMIC PROGRESS

To retain all financial aid awards, you must be aware of the following:

- Earn a 2.0 GPA each term and a 2.0 overall to maintain PELL., and a 3.0 overall to maintain HOPE.
- Complete 67% or more of your courses with an A, B or C grade (no withdrawals *after* the first 3 days of the term).
- Complete the program within a 150% maximum time frame. You must complete a certificate within 59 credit hours; a diploma in 89 credit hours, and an associates in 110 credit hours.
- Financial Aid is reinstated one time only. If you lose your aid a second time it is permanent.
- Only courses paid by PELL funds can be repeated once.

Students have one warning period followed by suspension if the terms are not met. There is an appeals process, although in some cases students may be expected to pay for some courses before financial aid is reinstated. Reinstatement appeals will not be considered if student's GPA is below 1.5 or completion rate is below 50%
