Executive Director Message

From The Executive Director

I was reviewing details from 2012 for the College's upcoming Annual Report and was reminded that I don't always remember to share with you all we have done and continue to do.

Some of what we accomplished last year:

- * Re-launched after a three year hiatus the Faculty and Staff Campaign and raised more than \$28,000
- * Implemented use of Raisers Edge donor management software and now have over 20,000 constituent records
- * Added new scholarships
- * Created and implemented phase one of a four phase plan to maximize return on, or sale, properties owned by the Foundation
- * Updated the Foundation website and launched an on-line giving option
- * Added 5 new Trustees
- * Re-started our fundraising

To name a few success so far this year, we've:

- * Entered phase three of the properties plan (sold two homes and working to get the third in-line to sale)
- * Added more scholarships (Ed Voyles Automotive Group Scholarship thanks to Mark Goodman!, the Scott MacKenzie Memorial Scholarship thanks to the Business Technology faculty, The Phyllis Abby Lantz Scholarship thanks to anonymous donors who are also working to include the Foundation in their estate plans)
- Checked off most of the requirements for the Role Model Board certification (we're getting close, but need a couple of things to come together on the individual trustee responsibilities before September!—we're in touch)
- * Raised more than \$95,000 for the campaign and College
- * Since September 2011, we've seen a 127% increase in giving! This continues to grow!
- * We have increased our number of donors 354%!
- * Achieved 100% participation of the Board!
- * Launched an Alumni effort to cultivate and raise money
- * Launched the Trustee Quarterly to keep our most important volunteers informed between meetings

Thank you for your ongoing support of the Foundation! We are truly improving the lives of our students!






