Italy Study Abroad Information & Itinerary (April 2-10, 2015 - CTC Spring Break)



Price of the Program and What's Included

- 4 nights in Rome, 2 nights in Florence, at a 2- or 3-star hotel (Breakfast included each morning)
- Hotel rooms are for three travelers, each with his/her own bed
- Airfare that leaves from Hartsfield Jackson International airport on Thursday, April 2, and returns April 9th
- Transportation to and from the various cities/sites that we will be visiting.
- Admission to the various museums/exhibits that we will attend
- A delicious pizza "Welcome" dinner in Rome, and a traditional dinner in a classic Florentine restaurant
- A leather-making demonstration at a leather workshop in Florence
- Local tour guide/Coordinator who will accompany us on all excursions during the trip
- In Rome Sightseeing tour of Vatican City, St. Peter's Basilica, the Sistine Chapel, the Colosseum, the Roman Forum, the Pantheon, the Piazza Navona, the Trevi Fountain
- In Florence Sightseeing tour of the Duomo, Michelangelo's statue of David, Botticelli's 'The Birth of Venus',
 the Piazza Della Signoria, the Ponte Vecchio bridge, Ghiberti's Gates of Paradise
- A visit to a local Italian university for an academic/cultural exchange with Italian students
- International health, travel and luggage insurance

Total Cost: *approximately \$3430 (this does not include CTC tuition and student fees)

Is Financial Aid Available and How do I pay for this trip?

While Financial Aid cannot apply to this trip, it can be applied to CTC tuition and Student Fees (assuming that you qualify). Therefore, the \$3430 which covers the cost of the trip must be paid by the traveler. Payment plans are available through the tour provider, allowing students to make monthly payments (the full cost of the trip must be paid one month before the date of departure).

Who can go on this trip?

<u>Only</u> enrolled students at CTC for the Spring 2015 semester are eligible to go on this trip. Any spouses/friends/parents/etc. who wish to go must be enrolled for Spring 2015 and taking one of the eligible courses. Additionally, all travelers must be a US Citizen AND have a current US Passport by the date of departure (we can assist students with the US Passport Application process).

How do I apply?

Interested students must fill out the Study Abroad application (attached in this email) and return it to either Frank Inscoe (Office B209.8 at the Marietta Campus) or Shari Szalwinski (Office B213 at the Paulding Campus), or through email. All applications will be evaluated by the Dean of Arts and Sciences, and approved applicants will be allowed to enroll in the trip by paying a \$95 non-refundable deposit by December 1*.

What courses are offered?

All travelers will be required to enroll in at least **ONE** of the following courses (with specific instructors) for the Spring 2015 semester in order to be eligible for the trip. Students will attend the course and complete the coursework for the enrolled class just like any other course. The specific CRN numbers for these courses will be released once the Spring Schedule has been publicized. While some of these courses will be online, others will meet at specific times and campuses.

- Sightseeing tour of Florence, including art of Michelangelo, and Botticelli's The Birth of Venus, as well as The Piazza della Signoria, and the Ponte Vecchio Bridge
- Tour the Santa Maria del Fiore Cathedral and the famed domed cap known as the Duomo, for a gorgeous view of the city
- Participate in a leather-making demonstration at an artisan leather workshop
- Enjoy a traditional Italian dinner together at a classic Florentine restaurant
