CLT Program Admission

Students seeking admission to the Clinical Laboratory Technology (CLT) Program must be fully admitted to the college for Spring Semester 2015. To take pre-admission courses, students should enroll in the college's Healthcare Science Certificate/Health Occupations Certificate.

The admission criteria consist of Admission Points with a total value of **340 points**. See the CLT Admission Points Criteria sheet for additional information.

Transfer Students / Transfer Credit

If you are a transfer student, you must be fully admitted to Chattahoochee Technical College by spring semester 2015. The College's document deadline is December 12, 2014.

If you are transferring college credit into Chattahoochee Technical College, official transcripts must be received by the college's document deadline, December 12, 2014.

HOBET V (5.0) ATI Assessment Test

Students must take the Health Occupations Basic Entrance Test (HOBET) Version 5.0 by <u>Wednesday, May 13, 2015</u> and achieve a minimum total adjusted score of <u>65.00</u>.

A student may take the HOBET <u>two (2) times in a calendar year</u> and <u>must wait a minimum of 30 calendar days</u> in between attempts. <u>A HOBET score is valid for five years and the Clinical Laboratory Technology Program will use the highest score.</u>

The HOBET is a standardized test that measures the student's ability in math, reading, grammar and science. A study guide and practice test can be purchased at www.atialliedhealth.com. The HOBET is available through the Chattahoochee Technical College's Continuing Education Department. If the HOBET is taken at another college or testing center, the report must be sent from ATI to Chattahoochee Technical College.

Application Session

Applicants must attend an Application Session during Spring Semester 2015. Applications are only distributed during application sessions. The schedule for the application sessions will be posted on the CLT webpage on the college's website at the beginning of Spring Semester.

Orientation

If admitted into the CLT program, all students must attend a **MANDATORY** orientation during Summer Semester, 2015.
