**Landmark 1**— The journey begins  
(possibly 2 or 3 semesters)

If you need to complete learning support classes you will want to schedule these along side one or two program classes each semester. Some of your program choices include:

- ✖ COMP 1000—Introduction to Computers
- ✖ CIST 1001— Computer Concepts
- ✖ CIST 1601—Information Security Fundamentals

Once all of your learning support classes are complete you can move on to Landmark 2.

**Landmark 2**— The journey continues  
(2 or 3 semesters)

Once all learning support classes are complete you can begin work on your General Education (GE) Core classes. See advisor to discuss other options.

- ✖ Area I - Language Arts (ENGL 1101)
- ✖ Area II—Social/Behavior Sciences (e.g. SOCI 1101)
- ✖ Area III—Natural Science/Mathematics (MATH 1111)
- ✖ Area IV—Humanities/Fine Arts (e.g. ARTS 1101)
- ✖ Area V—General Education Elective  
(e.g. ENGL 1102, PSYC 1101, HUMN 1101)
