- Check your class schedule periodically before the start of the term using your **BannerWeb** account, as classes may change rooms, meeting times or instructors.
- Plan a weekly schedule including class times, homework times, work schedule and personal time. Establish an effective homework and study location.
- Activate your CTC OneCard. Each student registered for courses at CTC will receive a CTC Higher One Card in the mail. All refunds are disbursed through the CTC OneCard process and are not available for pickup. You must go to the Higher One website, www.ctconecard.com, and register/activate your card, and then choose how you would like to receive your refunds.

Be on the lookout for your CTC OneCard! It will be sent to the address we have on file and will arrive in a green HigherOne envelope. Do not throw the envelope away— CTC cannot issue your refund if you have not activated your CTC OneCard.

To do once classes begin...

- Log into BLACKBOARD on the first day of the semester. BLACKBOARD is a web-based course management and collaboration portal that enables educators to manage course materials and to communicate with students. BLACKBOARD can function both as a complement to traditional courses and as a site for distance learning.
- ☐ Get a **Student Photo ID** and **parking pass** by visiting the Campus Police office once the semester begins.
- ☐ **View/print class schedule.** Check your **BannerWeb** account to view your class schedule each day during the first week of school.
- ☐ Visit the **Success Center** and learn about the tutoring services available for current students. Each campus has its own Success Center.
- □ Establish contact with your program team advisors Once you begin taking classes, these team members will serve as your advisors and assist you in creating an academic plan for future terms.
- Confirm your **Eagle Alert** account on the CTC website. This is a safety and crisis communication service that notifies students by SMS, email or phone in case of an emergency.

You may also want to...

- If you are still unsure about your career goals, make an appointment with **Career Services** for help identifying a career path that aligns with your personal needs, skills, abilities, interests and values.
- Arrange for any necessary disability accommodations prior to the start of classes with **Disability** Services.

Registration Tips

- It is the responsibility of the students to monitor the college calendar for registration dates and other important information.
- Make sure to have backup classes in mind when selecting classes in case some are filled or are offered at a time that does not fit into your schedule.
- Double check for any holds on your account prior to registration. If you have holds, contact the appropriate office for help.
- Be mindful that CTC offers courses in three formats:
 - Web-Enhanced: Courses that meet on campus in a traditional classroom setting but still require students to access online course content
 - Online: Online students are expected to master the material with minimal instructor assistance. All online courses require at least one proctored event on a CTC campus.
 - **Hybrid**: Similar to online classes but also meet on campus part of the time for face-to-face support
- We strongly encourage you to meet with your advisor before registering.





SWOOP SAYS:

CTC faculty and staff expect all students to be aware of information sent to student email accounts. If a message is sent to your CTC inbox, the college assumes that you have read it and understand it.

Please make sure you are informed by using your student email account on a daily basis.

As part of CTC's reaffirmation of accreditation process, the college has created the Educational Master Advising Plan (eMAP). Through the plan, CTC will formalize academic advising to support student success, graduation, and attainment of educational and career goals. Students will be empowered to take charge of their educational careers by sharing responsibility with their academic advisors for developing educational plans that are compatible with career aspirations. The first eMAP pilot group began Spring Semester 2014. The complete implementation will occur over five years and will impact all CTC students. Complaint Procedure: Chattahoochee Technical College practices a methodology that encourages that each complaint be handled as close to the source as possible. Why use DegreeWorks?

DegreeWorks is a computerized degree audit program and academic advising tool designed to assist you and advisors in reviewing your program progress by easily identifying courses you have completed and what courses you still need in order to fulfill your program requirements.

You can also use DegreeWorks to:

- Determine which courses students have taken or transferred, and which count as electives.
- Determine what requirements you must fulfill in order to complete your program of study.
- View individual course grades, cumulative grade-point average (GPA) and major GPA.
- View transfer credits, waivers and exemptions applied toward your program of study.
- See how coursework could be applied toward another major using the What If option.
- Estimate how many semesters it will take to graduate.
- Learn the prerequisites and co-requisites for courses by clicking on course numbers.
- · Confirm academic standing.

Register for Classes

- 1. Visit the CTC website www.chattahoocheetech.edu
- 2. On the home page, click on **me@CTC** at the top right hand side of the screen.
- 3. Click **BannerWeb** on the menu along the right hand side of the me@ctc page.
- 4. Type your **Student ID number** or your Social Security number in the User ID field without using dashes.
- 5. Type your **personal identification number (PIN)** in the PIN field. Your default banner web PIN is your birth date. (Example: Birth Date = April 21, 1959 PIN = 042159)
- 6. Click the **Login** button.
- 7. Click on **Continue** if you're asked to take a survey.
- 8. Click **Student Services and Financial Aid** at top of page.
- 9. Click **Registration**.
- 10. Click Add/Drop Classes.
- 11. Select the correct term and click **Submit Term**.
- 12. Choose one of the following options:

Option 1: You do not know your CRNs*

- Click Class Search. Click on the subject and choose one of the following options:
 - Click Course Search. Next choose the course number and click View Sections.

(OR)

- Click Advanced Search. Choose the subject, course number and campus and click Class Search
- Click the checkbox on the left side of the screen to indicate the course you need
- Click Register

Option 2: You know your CRNs*

- Scroll to the bottom of the page and enter CRN numbers in the input boxes
- Click Submit Changes

*CRN stands for **C**ourse **R**egistration **N**umber. Each class at CTC has a unique CRN. To find the CRN for your class:

- On the home page, click on **Programs & Courses**
- Click on Class Schedule located on the menu along the right side of the page
- Select the Term, Campus, and Subject and click on Look Up Classes
- When you find the class and time you want, write down the CRN of that class.
- 13. Scroll down and make sure all the classes you attempted to register for are showing and their status is **Registered Web** on the right side of the screen.
- 14. Print a copy of your schedule and your fee assessment.
- 15. Report to the business office to pay ANY balance that is due by the posted dates.

If you registered for an online course:

- Online courses require students to attend an on-campus event, usually an exam.
- All math online courses use Pearson My Math Lab to manage course content.
- All other online courses use BLACKBOARD to manage course content. If your schedule is dropped due to nonpayment or you add an online class during the **Drop/Add period** there may be a delay in your access to BLACK-BOARD.

Pay for Classes Online in BannerWeb

- 2. Click **me@CTC** at the top right hand corner of the screen
- 3. Click **BannerWeb** on the menu along the right hand side of the page
- 4. Type your **Student ID number** or your Social Security number in the User ID field without using dashes. (Example: User ID = 123456789)
- 5. Type your **personal identification number (PIN)** in the PIN field. Your default banner web PIN is your birth date. (Example: Birth Date = April 21, 1959 PIN = 042159)
- 6. Click the **Login** button.
- 7. Click on **Student Services & Financial Aid.**
- 8. Click on Student Records.
- 9. Click on **Account Summary** or **Account Summary by Term**.
- 10. Click **Pay Online** at the bottom of the screen.
- 11. Select the correct term for payment. Click **Select Term**.
- 12. Enter the balance that you are paying and click **Pay by Credit** or **Pay by Check**.
- 13. Enter the required information and be sure to enter your email address. Click **Continue Credit Card Payment** or **Continue Check Payment**.
- 14. Verify that the information entered is correct, and click **Complete Credit Card Payment** or **Complete Check Payment**.
- 15. The next screen will confirm this transaction. **PRINT THIS PAGE**. You will also receive an email receipt at the address that you provided with your payment information.
- 16. Be sure to exit the BannerWeb system (using the exit link) and close the web browser before leaving the computer to prevent the next user from having access to your records.

Withdraw From Courses

- 4. Type your **Student ID number** or your Social Security number in the User ID field without using dashes. (Example: User ID = 123456789)
- 5. Type your **personal identification number** (PIN) in the PIN field. Your default banner web PIN is your birth date. (Example: Birth Date = April 21, 1959 PIN = 042159)
- 6. Click the **Login** button.
- 7. Click on **Student Services & Financial Aid**.
- 8. Click Registration.
- 9. Click **Add/Drop Classes**.
- 10. Select the correct term. Click **Submit**.
- 11. Scroll to bottom of page and find the course you wish to WITHDRAW from.
- 12. Click the drop down box to the right of the course and choose **Self Service Withdrawal**.
- 13. Click **Submit Changes**.
- 14. Once this has been submitted, it **CANNOT BE REVERSED**.

Withdrawing from a class may affect your eligibility to remain in other courses on your schedule. Excessive withdrawals may also affect your financial aid eligibility due to the 67% completion rate standard for Satisfactory Academic Progress.

- 4. Click **User Registration** Enter your CTC User Name (example Jsmith1); Enter your current password (default is CTC-mmddyy); Click Submit.
- 5. Complete the Security Questions or Verification Code to add an email address to register your account. It is recommended to do both options and list a personal email address.
- 6. Click Enroll and you are complete.

- 6. Request a Verification Code, check the personal email account you added during registration, enter the verification code, then click continue.
- 7. Reset Password using requirements listed
- 8. Enter your new password, confirm your new password, enter the Captcha Code, then click Reset Password.

- Your username NEVER changes.
