ADMISSION STEPS

Submit a completed <u>admission application</u> and a nonrefundable \$25.00 application fee in U.S. currency by credit card, money order or check drawn on a U.S. bank payable to Chattahoochee Technical College by the appropriate admission deadline.

Submit <u>official transcripts</u> from your high school (or GED) and all colleges attended by the application <u>deadline</u>. All transcripts must be received in envelopes sealed by the sending institution. Applicants with a college degree will send college transcripts from all colleges attended but are not required to submit a high school or GED transcript.

All international transcripts must be evaluated by an approved evaluation service and sent directly to CTC. We recommend the following evaluation agencies:

- For high school transcripts or diplomas submit a <u>document by document</u> evaluation or <u>General</u> evaluation
- Students with college credit or a degree from a college or university outside the United States must submit a course-by-course evaluation of the transcript.
- ♦ Documents not in English need to be translated
- We will accept evaluations from NACES and AICE member agencies.



IMMIGRATION DOCUMENTATION FOR I-20 (F and M STATUS)

If you are applying for, or have F or M student visa, supply the following documentation:

Submit official scores from one of the following placement tests taken within the last 5 years: SAT, ACT, ASSET, or Accuplacer.

Submit <u>original financial documentation</u> as required by the U.S. government.

• The school estimates that it will cost \$20,361 USD to study at CTC for one academic year. One academic year equals 2 academic semesters or 8 months. For one academic year:

Tuition and Fees (estimated cost)	\$9,190 USD
Books (estimated cost)	\$1,100 USD
Living Expenses (estimated cost)	\$10,107 USD
TOTAL (estimated cost)	\$20,397 USD

• The student or sponsor must provide a bank statement verifying that a minimum of \$20,397 USD is available to finance the first year of education. Bank contact information and telephone number printed clearly. Financial documentation must be dated within the last three months.

OBTAINING A STUDENT VISA

- 1. Obtain Form I-20 and a letter of acceptance from Chattahoochee Tech.
- 2. Pay SEVIS I-901 Fee. Currently the SEVIS fee to obtain an F, M, or J visa is \$200. Payment must be paid prior to the visa appointment with the U.S. Embassy. For payment options and further information, visit www.FMJfee.com. Student is required to bring a copy of the SEVIS fee payment receipt (showing proof of payment) to the visa interview.
- 3. Find the U.S. Embassy closest to your home at http://www.usembassy.gov/. Check the consular site to see if there are any special instructions for the consulate you will be visiting.
- 4. Make an appointment with the embassy for the visa interview.

Arrival Information: At the port-of-entry to the U.S., the student will be interviewed again and the Arrival/Departure Form I-94 will be issued. The earliest date of entry into the U.S. allowed is 30 dates prior to the start date indicated on your Form I-20. The student will not be allowed entry into the U.S. beyond the start date. The student is required to make an appointment (telephone: 770-528-4528 or 770-528-5804) with Chattahoochee Technical College's International Services Office after arrival in Atlanta to complete U.S. Citizenship and Immigration Service requirements. An international student orientation will be provided before the term begins.

<u>IMPORTANT INFORMATION</u> Chattahoochee *Technical College will NOT accept faxed or photocopies as official documents.*

Application Deadlines

Due to the amount of time required for gathering, preparing and processing the immigration paperwork, CTC encourages all international applicants to apply at least <u>one semester prior to their desired start date</u>.

CTC semesters generally start as follows:

Fall Semester - August

Spring Semester- January

Summer Semester - May
