


Chattahoocchee Tech serves more than 10,500 students through eight campuses and online learning. Requests by industries in the college's six-county service area for a trained workforce in advanced manufacturing technologies have been increasing over the last five years.

To answer employers' needs, Chattahoochee Technical College is proposing a facility dedicated to advanced manufacturing training.

Manufacturing Industries and Economic Development offices have requested additional education/ training in advanced manufacturing for credit and non-credit. Current instructional space is inadequate

to support this training, both from the space available as well as the age of the facility. The proposed Center for Advanced Manufacturing will house credit programs and the associated non-credit training in Industrial Maintenance, which includes PLCs (programmable logic controllers) and Robotics; Computer Numerical Controls, Welding, and Advanced Machining.



TCSG State Board has recently approved the college to implement a diploma in Computer Numerical Controls (CNC) Technology. This program, along with the college's current offering in Industrial Maintenance and Electrical Technology, as well as Welding, would provide multiple workforce opportunities for our service area. The diploma in CNC Technology provides training in machine tool technology, including lathe and mill operations, CNC Manual programming, and CAD/CAM programming.

CTC will locate the Advanced Manufacturing and Emerging Technologies at the college's North Metro campus (in the center of our service area) in order to serve the largest number of industries and students.
