In order to adhere to requirements and standards as set by the Higher education Act of 1965, the Drug-Free Schools and Communities Act and the Drug-Free Workplace Act of 1988, CTC has developed a comprehensive drug and alcohol awareness and prevention plan.

Plan Objectives

- Educate Students and Employees about the effects of drug and alcohol abuse on overall health, wellness, and social wellbeing.
- **Support** Students and Employees struggling with drug and alcohol related issues by having referral services information and designated staff available for counsel.
- **Maintain** A drug and alcohol free environment by informing, educating, and supporting students and employees.
