

# **ADMISSIONS**



Placement testing determines your current knowledge level in reading, writing, and math. Based on your results, you may be required to enroll in learning support coursework or to retest. Minimum scores are required for admission. Testing is untimed but typically takes two hours to complete all sections. CTC will accept test scores that are up to five years old.




Starting college is a big step, and we are here to help you. Our Student Affairs staff can answer questions or show you around campus.



# **Your Career Path**

Choosing a Certificate takes 8 weeks to 1 year after which you may choose to join the workforce or continue on the path to a Diploma. Choosing a Diploma takes 1 to 5 years after which you may choose to join the workforce or continue on the path to an Associates Degree. Choosing an Associates Degree takes 2 to 2.5 years after which you may choose to join the workforce.
