Program: Respiratory Care (RC)

Program Location: Canton Campus

Admissions Format: Competitive Admissions. Applicants are ranked according to total admission points, and the applicants with the highest total points are offered available seats. Admission decisions sent via Chatt Tech student email, typically in December each year.

Course Enrollment and Schedule: Closed enrollment, fixed sequence. Only students accepted to the RC Program can enroll in RESP courses. RESP courses are taken in a fixed, pre-determined sequence each semester. Schedule is full-time, Monday – Friday. Classes primarily in person with some hybrid/online portions.

Program Length: Program is designed to be completed in a total of 7 or 8 semesters, including pre-requisites and occupational coursework.

Pre-requisites Courses: Recommended 2 or 3 semesters, 28 credits. Program prerequisite courses can be completed at any campus and in any order that follows college prerequisite requirements.

Occupational Coursework: Required 5 semesters, 50 credits. Occupational courses are completed in a fixed, pre-determined sequence.

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Steps to Apply to Respiratory Care Program

Step 1: Apply to Chattahoochee Tech and be accepted.

Student 900# and email address are required to apply to Health Sciences programs (Step 2).

Step 2: Apply to the specific Health Sciences Program.

Application Open: November 01

Application Close: Last day of Fall Semester (A/C Terms) as listed on the [college calendar](#).

Step 3: Meet all admissions criteria by the published deadlines.

Required Prerequisite Coursework – Admission Points

Points are awarded for these courses using the criteria described for each item. A grade of C or higher is required for all courses. Courses taken during Fall Semester will meet this deadline.

***Important Note:** Health Sciences Admissions criteria consider multiple courses in Area III to award admission points, but you must have a passing credit for courses MATH 1111 to meet the requirements for this degree. If necessary, contact the [Records Office](#) to review your records.

Required Prerequisite Coursework – No Points

These courses are required but are not considered for admission points. A grade of C or higher is required for all courses. Courses taken during Fall Semester will meet this deadline.

Fall Transfer Credit

If coursework is completed at another institution during Fall Semester, please transfer the credit promptly to avoid errors with your application. If you experience a delay, email Health Sciences Admission at HealthSciences.Admission@chattahoocheetech.edu to assist with your application.

Prerequisite High School Transfer Credit

High School Transfer credit is considered to meet ENGL 1101, MATH 1111, and PSYC 1101 courses only. Letter grade and points are awarded on the following criteria:

Highschool Credit	Scale
Advanced Placement (AP)	Minimum score is 3. 3 = C, 4 = B, 5 = A.
International Baccalaureate (IB)	Minimum score is 4. 4 or 5 = C, 6 = B, 7 = A
College Level Examination Program (CLEP)	Minimum score is 50. All scores 50 and above = C.

Required ATI TEAS Standardized Test – Fall Deadline

Item	Points
ATI TEAS Version 7	• Must be taken in person at a Chatt Tech college campus • Minimum required score = 70.00 • Points awarded equal 50% of composite score, maximum 50.00 points.

ATI TEAS test must be taken in person at a Chattahoochee Technical College campus. A student may take the ATI TEAS two (2) times in a calendar year and must wait a minimum of 30 calendar days between attempts. The ATI TEAS score is valid for five years.

The ATI TEAS is a standardized test that measures the student's ability in math, reading, grammar, and science. A study guide and practice test can be purchased at ATI. The ATI TEAS is available through the [Chattahoochee Technical College's Testing Center](#).

Deadline to take the ATI TEAS is the last day of Fall Semester (A/C Terms) as listed on the [college calendar](#).

Note: After you complete the ATI TEAS on a Chattahoochee Technical College campus, scores will automatically be reported. You do not need to submit scores with your application.

Optional Observation Hours – Fall Deadline

Observation hours are not required but can earn additional points towards application. Students may earn 10 optional points by completing observation hours by the deadline. See Instructions for Observation Hours in this document for instructions. Incomplete hours or documentation submitted after the deadline will not earn points. Hours may be verified by the program.

All documentation must be submitted using the link on the program webpage, “Respiratory Care Optional Observation Hours Submission”. Documents are uploaded via the college’s Etrieve Platform. Carefully follow the instructions provided on the form.

Please note: paper or email documentation will no longer be accepted. All documentation must be submitted electronically using the link provided on the program webpage. The only exception is documentation previously submitted during the 2026 application cycle and already on file with Health Sciences Admission.

Observation hours submitted with the 2026 application cycle and currently on file with Health Sciences Admissions will be accepted. Observation hours submitted for the 2025 application cycle or earlier will not be accepted.

Deadline to submit Optional Items is the last day of Fall Semester (A/C Terms) as listed on the [college calendar](#).

Competitive Admissions Tie Breaker

In the event of a tie in total admissions points, the following criteria will be used to determine admission.

1. The applicant with the higher total GPA of all pre-requisite courses will be ranked higher.
2. If a tie remains, the applicant with the higher BIOL GPA will be ranked higher
3. If a tie remains, the applicant with the higher Science GPA will be ranked higher

Respiratory Care Optional Observation Hours Instructions

Purpose

- A firsthand understanding of the daily responsibilities of a respiratory therapist.
- To receive exposure to patient care procedures, respiratory equipment, and clinical workflow in a hospital setting.
- Opportunity to observe respiratory therapy services such as oxygen therapy, ventilator management, aerosol treatments, and patient assessments.
- An informed perspective to confirm interest in the respiratory care profession.

Requirements

- Twelve (12) observation hours must be completed in a hospital respiratory therapy department under supervision of a licensed respiratory therapist (CRT or RRT).
- Observation must be completed within 12 months prior to the application deadline.
- Observation hours are all-or-nothing; partial hours will not be accepted.
- All experiences must be documented on the official Respiratory Care Observation Verification Form and signed by the supervising therapist.
- Dress Code: medical scrubs or business casual attire. Jeans, shorts, T-shirts, leggings, and open-toed shoes are not permitted.
- Applicants must comply with all hospital confidentiality and infection control policies.

Instructions to Complete Hours

- Print the Respiratory Care Observation Verification Form from this document.
- Contact a hospital respiratory therapy department to request observation permission, and complete at least 12 hours of observation.
- Have the supervising therapist complete and sign the verification form.

Instructions to Submit Observation Hours

- All documentation must be submitted using the link on the program webpage, “Respiratory Care Optional Observation Hours Submission”. Documents are uploaded via the college’s Etrieve Platform. Carefully follow the instructions provided on the form.
- Observation Hours that are verified by program faculty will earn optional points.
