Registration Deadline

The registration deadline for most courses is five business days prior to a course beginning. Late registrations may be taken within four days if the course has been confirmed, textbooks and supplies are available, and there are no extenuating circumstances that may prevent the student, instructor, or CTC staff from being fully prepared for the course as a result of accepting a late registration.

Payment

Registration is only considered complete at the time payment is received. We accept American Express, Discover, Master Card, VISA, checks, money orders, cash (only when paid in person) or through company invoicing (in some situations). Checks should be made payable to Chattahoochee Technical College.

Refund and Cancellation Policy

If CTC deems it necessary to cancel a class or testing session for any reason, you will be notified with as much advance notice as possible. If we cancel or change a class or test, you will receive a full refund or have the option to transfer to another class date or testing session, if one is available.

With the exception of ATI TEAS and ACT WorkKeys assessment sessions, requests for refunds made at least five business days prior to a course beginning are eligible for a full refund. There are no refunds for requests made less than five business days prior to a course beginning. Additionally, there are no refunds nor will transfers be made after the registration is completed for ATI TEAS and ACT WorkKeys assessment sessions; therefore, please be sure that you have met with your advisor to ensure you are ready to take the assessment and that the date that you have selected is indeed the date you are available.

Your refund will be issued by a check and can take up to four to six weeks to be processed.

Attendance Policy

It is strongly recommended that you attend every class. It is understood that occasions may not permit your attendance and it is recommended you proactively inquire as to what you will miss or may have already missed during those classes. More specific attendance polices may apply for each course and will be discussed during each class.

Financial Assistance

Several of our training options have been approved for funding by the Workforce Innovation and Opportunity Act (WIOA) or through Veterans Affairs (VA) benefits. Each course that is eligible for this funding will be noted by the course title.

Workforce Innovation and Opportunity Act (WIOA)

The Workforce Innovation and Opportunity Act (WIOA) was created to provide state and local areas the flexibility to collaborate across systems in an effort to better address the employment and skills needs of current employees, jobseekers, and employers. WIOA training funds are designed to serve laid-off individuals and eligible, low-income adults who are in need of training to enter the labor market. WIOA at Chattahoochee Technical College serves three (3) workforce regions Your specific region is determined by the county in which you reside, or it may also be the county of the company from which you were laid off.

Military (VA GI Bill) Education Benefits

Active duty and honorable discharged members of the Navy, Army, Air Force, and Marines may qualify for educational benefits based on coverage through the GI Bill. In addition, many veterans can benefit from the Post-9/11 GI Bill which provides financial support for education for those veterans with at least 90 days of continuous service after September 11, 2001. Others veterans with service-connected disability may qualify after 30 days of service. Benefits may also apply to those on active duty, their spouses and children. Military Spouse (MyCAA) Education Benefits

Spouses of veterans may also qualify for programs through the Military Spouse Career Advancement Account (MyCAA). This unique program allows spouses of veterans up to \$4,000 for educational training in continuing education, degree programs, licenses, or credentials leading to a high-demand job. HeartSaver CPR with AED

This 3-hour classroom course provides training in basic CPR and AED skills such as giving CPR to an infant, child, or an adult; using an Automated External Defibrillator (AED); and using a mask or barrier device. Certification card is included.

Attendees must either be in the healthcare field and carry a current 2015 Guidelines BLS for Healthcare Provider certification card or do the online updates for BLS and HeartSaver. If not in the healthcare field, you must carry BOTH a 2015 Guidelines BLS for Healthcare Provider card and a current Guidelines HeartSaver First Aid certification card. Attendees whose certification card is not the most current guidelines will be required to complete the online instructor updates. These courses are not an extra fee. You must bring this certificate with you to class. After completion of the instructor course, participants must choose from two dates to be monitored teaching a course.

Commercial Truck Driving Certificate Program (Class A)

Approved for WIOA

The purpose of the Commercial Truck Driving certificate program is to prepare students for careers in commercial truck driving. The program emphasizes specialized training in fundamentals of CTD, basic CTD operation, and advanced CTD operation over a 7 ½ week period.

Admission Requirements: For regular admission, an applicant must be at least 18 years of age*, complete an application, pay the application fee, and achieve the appropriate scores on the placement test.

*The Commercial Truck Driving program prefers applicants to be 21 years of age or older. Students 18 to 20 years of age may operate a commercial truck only in the State of Georgia, and therefore, may have limited employment opportunities. Therefore, students under 21 must meet with the Director of Admissions and complete an acknowledgment form stating that they understand the restrictions on employment and training opportunities in the trucking industry. Additionally, students must:

- Obtain a 7-year Motor Vehicle Report (MVR) from the State of Georgia Highway Patrol
- Have a valid driver's license and have no more than eight points (or five points in one year) or four moving violations on the Georgia Violator Scale
- Not have any DUI violations in the last seven years
- Successfully pass a NIDA 5 drug screen after CTC receives the MVR
- Pass the Department of Transportation (DOT) physical examination The coursework in the following TCC curriculum may have prerequisite courses that must be completed prior to enrolling in the courses. All TCCs offered at the college require a minimum of appropriate certificate/diploma placement test scores OR completion of any required learning support courses through the diploma exit point.



Georgia Retraining Tax Credit

Firms which provide certain types of training to their employees are able to receive a tax credit when filing their state tax returns. Qualified programs include ERP and SAP systems, changes in operating systems, computer training, quality initiatives such as ISO 9000, and technology training on new equipment. The credit allows up to \$500 per person per program per year. Unused credits may be carried forward for 10 years.


Manufacturing Fundamentals






