To use this program guide effectively, you must access your DegreeWorks and speak with an advisor.

Questions to ask yourself:

“What college are you thinking of transferring to?” “What are you going to study there?” “Have you checked out that college’s transfer requirements?”

Considerations while attending CTC:

- Most 4-year colleges require two History classes, Political Science, a year of Freshman Composition, and at least one Humanities/Fine Arts class.
- How much English/Humanities/Fine Arts? English 1101, 1102, a Lit class, & a course in THEA, ARTS, MUSC, etc.
- More Math? Is taking College Algebra really going to fulfill my Math core? Will I need Pre-Calculus, Calculus, and/or Statistics?
- Does the college I want to transfer to require a foreign language? If so, Spanish is offered @ CTC!
- Does the college I want to transfer to require a Communication COMM1100 or Public Speaking SPCH 1101 class? If so, both are offered @ CTC!
- Does the college I want to transfer to require Economics? If so, Economics is offered @ CTC!
- Can I get my Sciences done at CTC? What about other Sciences? Biology 1111/1112/2107/2108? CHEM 1151/1152/1211/1212? PHYS 1110/1111/1112?
- COMP1000/COMP 1500 may transfer, so I should check before taking this class!
- Learning Support courses (00 courses) do not transfer.

Remember: Check out the 4-year college’s transfer requirements!
