



## Advisement for Interiors Associate of Applied Science Degree or Diploma

The Interiors Degree offers a broad skill level for our Interior Design educational programs.

Course content includes a broad spectrum of skills necessary in the work force for the design of residential interiors, commercial space design and planning, plus the specialization needed for kitchen and bath certified design.
