Dental Assisting Program Admission:

Students seeking admission to the Dental Assisting (DA) Program must be fully admitted to the college for Spring Semester 2024. To take pre-admission courses for the diploma program, students should enroll in the college's *Healthcare Assistant Certificate*.

Application Session:

All students must attend a Virtual Application Session and complete a Program Application. Program applications are <u>only</u> given out at the Application Sessions. A schedule of the Dental Assisting sessions will be available at the beginning of Spring Semester 2024 and posted on the Dental Assisting webpage. Late arrivals will not be permitted to enter the session. Additional Diploma Courses:

To take any of these courses prior to starting the dental assisting program, students should enroll in the college's Healthcare Assistant Certificate, Healthcare Science Certificate or Interdisciplinary Studies Degree-Health Track. Students who do not complete all the diploma level courses by the end of the dental assisting program will be awarded the appropriate Certificates in Dental Assisting. After graduating from the dental assisting program, students may continue taking these courses to meet the criteria to receive a diploma in dental assisting.

Immunizations:

Chattahoochee Technical College does not require vaccinations as criteria for admission and enrollment of students; however, immunizations are required for college health programs by our clinical partners. Students may not complete clinical rotations without meeting clinical site immunization requirements. All required vaccinations must be complete prior to starting clinical practice. Students completing internships or practicums in other majors must adhere to all job site vaccination guidelines. Clinical and job site requirements can and do change without notice or input from the College.

Final Class Selection:

The selection criteria, in the past has been for the diploma program only and has consisted of Admission Points with a total value of 110. This year, we are transitioning to add certificates in Basic Dental Assisting, Advanced Dental Assisting, Coronal Polishing, and Expanded Duties. Those students seeking a diploma will need to complete the pre-requisite classes. Those seeking a certificate(s) need only to apply. Students that have completed pre-requisite courses for admissions to the Dental Assisting diploma program will be seated first, for this new, transitional, academic year. The certificate programs will be seated after the diploma seeking students on a first come basis.
