Program Start:

Program begins every Fall Semester

STEP 1: Prior to applying to the Physical Therapist Assistant program, all prospective students must first apply via the website to the college, be admitted, and have a student ID number.

STEP 2: View Mandatory Program Video Session

Applicants must view the program video in order to submit the program application. The video is located on our website by following these steps to reach the program page. The deadline to view the Program Video Session and submit an application is the end of the Spring Semester.

STEP 4: Final Class Selection will take place in the months of June or July.

Competitive Physical Therapist Assistant Program Admission:

Students seeking admission to the Physical Therapist Assistant Program must be fully admitted to the college with transcripts fully evaluated (for transfer credits) by the end of Spring Semester.

The Physical Therapist Assistant program has a competitive admission process. The selection criteria consist of Admission Points with a total value of **370 points**. See the Surgical Technology Admission Points Criteria sheet for additional information.

All students must have a GPA of **2.0** or higher to be considered for program admission.

Required Pre-Admission Course Work:

Complete the following pre-admission courses with a grade of “C” or higher by **the end of the Spring Semester**. If a course is taken more than once, the attempt with the highest grade will be accepted.

**Trigonometry (MATH 1112), Pre-Calculus (MATH 1113) or Calculus I (MATH 1131) may be substituted for College Algebra.*

Optional Course Work:

This category is not required but can earn additional points towards application if completed by the **end of the Spring Semester**. Students may earn a maximum of 20 optional points from **one** of the following courses. If more than one course is completed, only the course with the highest grade will earn points.

**Satisfactorily completed coursework of both PHYS 1111 & PHYS 1111L –Introductory Physics I and PHYS 1112 & PHYS 1112L-Introductory Physics II classes will fulfill the requirement of PHYS 1110.*

***Humanities Elective- Select one: ENGL 2110, ENGL 2130, HUMN 1101, ARTS 1101, MUSC 1101, MUSC 2040, THEA 1101*

Optional Observation Hours:

This category is not required but can earn additional points towards application. Students may earn a maximum of 20 optional points by completing 6 hours of observation in an Outpatient setting AND 6 hours in an Inpatient setting. See the Observation Verification Form on the program webpage for additional information and instructions to submit required documentation. All hours must be submitted on or before **the last day of the month of April** in order to receive extra points. Observation hours received after this date will not be accepted.

ATI TEAS (Version 7):

Take the ATI TEAS Version 7 by **the last day of the month of April**, and achieve a minimum total adjusted score of **70.00**. A student may take the ATI TEAS two (2) times in a calendar year and must wait a minimum of 30 calendar days in between attempts. The ATI TEAS score is valid for five years.

The ATI TEAS is a standardized test that measures the student's ability in math, reading, grammar and science. A study guide and practice test can be purchased at [ATI](#). The ATI TEAS is available through the Chattahoochee Technical College's [Testing Center](#).

Immunizations:

Chattahoochee Technical College does not require vaccinations as criteria for admission and enrollment of students; however, immunizations are required for college health programs by our clinical partners. Students may not complete clinical rotations without meeting clinical site immunization requirements. All required vaccinations must be complete prior to starting clinical practice. Students completing internships or practicums in other majors must adhere to all job site vaccination guidelines. Clinical and job site requirements can and do change without notice or input from the College.

Academic Advisement:

Final Class Selection:

Final class selection is based upon the total number of Admission Points. The students with the highest point value will be accepted into the program. A mandatory program orientation date will be posted in the student's acceptance letter. All notification letters are emailed to Chatt Tech student email addresses. Once accepted, student program of study will be changed to Physical Therapist Assistant.

CPR:

Once accepted into the Physical Therapist Assistant program, students must be certified in CPR for "Healthcare Providers" by the beginning of the Spring Semester of the following year.
