Program Start:

Program begins every Fall Semester

STEP 1: Prior to applying to the Radiography program, all prospective students must first apply via the website to the college, be admitted and have a student ID number.

STEP 2: View Program Video Session – Mandatory

Applicants must view the program video in order to submit the program application. The video is located on our website by following these steps to reach the program page. Applications will be reviewed by end of the Spring Semester.

STEP 3: Complete all required Pre-Admission Course Work:

STEP 4: Final Class Selection will take place in the months of June or July.

Competitive Radiography Program Admission:

Students seeking admission to the Radiography Program must be fully admitted to the college with transcripts fully evaluated (for transfer credits) by the end of Spring Semester.

The Radiography program has a competitive admission process. The selection criteria consist of Admission Points with a total value of **320 points**. See the Radiography Admission Points Criteria sheet for additional information.

All students must have a GPA of **3.0** or higher in pre-requisite courses to be considered for program admission.

Course Attempts and Point Calculations:

Students are allowed two attempts in the Anatomy and Physiology I and Anatomy and Physiology II courses that will be awarded as admission points. Should a student attempt these classes more than twice, only the first two attempts will be considered when calculating admission points.

ATI TEAS (Version 7):

Take the ATI TEAS (Version 7) by **the last day of the month of April**, and achieve a minimum total adjusted score of **75.00**. A student may take the ATI TEAS two (2) times in a calendar year and must wait a minimum of 30 calendar days in between attempts. The ATI TEAS score is valid for five years. **ATI TEAS test must be taken at a Chattahoochee Technical College campus.** TEAS Scores already on file with Health Sciences Admissions from *last year's 2025* admit applications will be accepted even if not taken on campus.

The ATI TEAS is a standardized test that measures the student's ability in math, reading, grammar and science. A study guide and practice test can be purchased at [ATI Testing](#). The ATI TEAS is available through the Chattahoochee Technical College [Testing Center](#).

Immunizations:

Chattahoochee Technical College does not require vaccinations as criteria for admission and enrollment of students; however, immunizations are required for college health programs by our clinical partners. Students may not complete clinical rotations without meeting clinical site immunization requirements. All required vaccinations must be complete prior to starting clinical practice. Students completing internships or practicums in other majors must adhere to all job site vaccination guidelines. Clinical and job site requirements can and do change without notice or input from the College.

Final Class Selection:

Final class selection is based upon the total number of Admission Points. The students with the highest point value will be accepted into the program. A mandatory program orientation date will be posted in the student's acceptance letter. All notification letters are emailed to Chatt Tech student email addresses. Once accepted, student program of study will be changed to Radiography.

Academic Advisement:

Observation Hours:

All hours must be submitted on or before **the last day of the month of April**, in order to receive extra points. Observation hours received after this date will not be accepted. Please review the Observation Hour Criteria Form for detailed information.

Applicants who hold a current certification or license in one of the following healthcare disciplines will receive **10 bonus points** toward their admission score:

- Licensed EMT or Advanced EMT
- Certified Medical Assistant (CMA)
- Licensed Practical Nurse (LPN)
- Certified Nursing Assistant (CNA)
- Certified Pharmacy Technician (CPhT)

- Certified Phlebotomist (CPT)
- Certified Dental Assistant (CDA)
- Certified Patient Care Technician (CPCT)
